Guest speaker **Matthew Dominguez, Public Policy Manager, Farm Animal Protection for the Humane Society of the United States**, is headquartered in Washington, D.C. The title of his presentation will be “Moving the Ball Forward for Farm Animals,” where he will address the most pressing legislative issues facing farm animals and the progress being made to help them. The ALC Business Meeting will follow Matthew’s presentation.

Born and raised in northern California, Matthew Dominguez spent his childhood on his family’s cattle ranch. He graduated with honors from California State University in Sacramento, with a bachelor’s degree in Business Administration and a minor in Philosophy. In 2007, he moved to Portland, Oregon to attend Lewis & Clark Law School for the Environmental Law program, but quickly changed his focus and began devoting his time and energy to the Animal Law program after learning about the plight of animals. He has gained practical experience as a legal clerk for the Center for Animal Law Studies and as an Intern in the Equine Protection Department at the Humane Society of the United States. After graduating from Lewis & Clark with his JD degree, Matthew joined the [Farm Animal Protection Campaign at the Humane Society of the United States](#) and works to expand the number of and breadth of laws that protect farm animals from cruelty as the campaign’s public policy manager.
