Responsibilities

- Write and develop grant and sponsorship proposals and reports as needed.
 Previous experience and proven track record with Pittsburgh area funders are preferred.
- Assist in identifying corporate, foundation, and individual prospects and conduct research to determine interest and giving potential.
- Write and develop annual giving campaign materials and work with the Communications department to determine a timeline and graphics.
- Support the Director of Development and Grantmaking in designing and fundraising for all special events.
- Maintain an accurate development calendar inclusive of application and reporting deadlines.
- Work with the Director of Development and Grantmaking and other staff to organize, coordinate, and implement all activities related to annual applications, reports, and supporting materials.
- Research new opportunities and assist the Director of Development and Grantmaking in managing these relationships.
- Project management: All Arts Council staff manage projects and deadlines and should be proactive in their project management.

This is a full-time, exempt salaried position. Occasional weekend and evening work may be necessary. Salary is posted at \$50,000 - \$55,000, commensurate with experience. The Arts Council offers a 403(b) employee-contribution retirement plan.

Remote work

This position supports hybrid work, with most of the work occurring remotely and occasional onsite work occurring at the Arts Council's offices located in the Cultural District in Downtown Pittsburgh. Employees are provided an organization-issued laptop for the duration of employment. Our office has an open floor plan. Candidates working in our offices should expect to work in an environment with background noise, variable temperatures, and frequent interruptions. When working remotely, you are expected to maintain a high-speed Internet connection supporting collaborative work, such as Zoom meetings.
