SUSTAINABILITY COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

Research & Development: Green Lease Project; Sustainable Leasing Process and Principles

While much focus and many articles have been published on high performing building ratings for new construction (e.g. LEED, Green Globe, BREEAM, etc), most of the existing building stock was not built to green standards. Thus, if we are to quickly and significantly reduce environmental impacts from commercial real estate, we must focus more attention on existing buildings. As a further complication, much of the commercial market is currently leased rather than owned. Leasing often creates a “split-incentive” where the landlord and the tenant's interests are not fully aligned and the proper economic incentives for reducing the environmental impacts (aka greening) of the facility or workplace may be decoupled from the activity. Several groups have proposed green leasing frameworks to address this opportunity but it is our hypothesis that effective sustainable leasing processes and principles are rarely implemented or understood by the real estate community.



The goal of this project is to foster the adoption of sustainable leasing processes and principles to promote an environment where landlords and tenants are partnering to provide a more sustainable workplace (i.e. less environmental impacts, lower energy use, lower water use, recycling options, etc). Specifically, the goal is to reach the end-user community with:

- A clear understanding of the value of incorporating sustainable elements in the leasing process;
- An explanation of the differences between traditional and non-traditional leases (definitions, business value, etc);
- A comparative assessment of existing “green” or sustainable leases that allows a user to select an appropriate template for their application; ; and,
- Easy-to-use guidelines and guidance that allow end-user to develop and negotiate a sustainable lease throughout the leasing process.

This project started with input from members in the CoreNet Global MidAtlantic Chapter as well as several other experienced professionals. We are also engaging with several environmental non-profits and related groups. Learning Initiatives

The Learning Committee plays a key part in expanding the Sustainability Community's goals and objectives by designing and delivering opportunities for professional development focused on sustainability. As we move forward, we will deliver learning opportunities through existing channels such as CoreNet Global's MCR and SLCR seminars as well as stand-alone events.

Over the past six months, the Learning Committee developed a curriculum framework for the MCR/SLCR coursework and we are reaching out to the larger CoreNet Global Community for support in populating the courses with materials and presenters. Our long-term goals include the development of a professional certification to identify corporate real estate professionals who have invested in



sustainability training. This designation is expected to be integrated into the MCR seminars and lead to a designation of Master of Corporate Real Estate & Sustainability (MCRs) as well as have a stand-alone designation. In the upcoming months, our initiatives include:

- Developing a Webinar schedule and Webinar content
- Incorporating the Committee's curriculum into the MCR (Master of Corporate Real Estate) Seminars

COMMITTEE SPOTLIGHT

In each quarterly newsletter, we will Spotlight a Committee to engage participation and collaboration. Our first Committee Spotlight is the Research and Development Committee.

The Research and Development (R&D) Committee stimulates, coordinates, disseminates and supports the conduct of research and development projects. These include investigating and disseminating best practices, guidelines, resources, and comparisons of sustainable and socially responsible real estate practices and knowledge. Although our core concern is adopting and implementing sustainable design and construction of the tangible facility and surrounding landscape, the Committee takes a holistic approach, considering sustainable practices in organizational work and workplace which includes group locations, commute patterns, meeting and travel patterns, and building characteristics.



Over the past six months, the Committee designed a structure and process mainly relying on the Sustainability Community's microsite and outreach to the chapters for involving the greater CoreNet Global Community. We seek suggestions and considerations of research projects, coordinating of these projects, and soliciting funding. Additionally, the Committee prepared three charters for research projects:

- **Green Leases:** Assessment and recommendation to increase the adoption of green leases in commercial real estate, led by Stephen Evanko. The Green Leases project was launched with the Mid-Atlantic Chapter.
- **Annotated Resources:** The research, evaluation and outlining of the primary sustainability resources for CoreNet Global members, led by Doug Gottlieb.
- **Green Workplaces Benchmarking:** The preparation of an approach for evaluating and comparing the sustainability of the corporate workplace and real estate portfolio, led by Stephen Evanko, Joe Ouye and Hal Levin.

In the upcoming months the R&D Committee's plans include:

- Soliciting additional research proposals from the CoreNet Global Community
- Conducting outreach to selected Chapters to encourage involvement
- Selecting the most promising research projects for the solicitation of sponsor support
