Annual membership dues are first based on installed system cooling capacity in Tons Refrigeration (TR), which then determines annual fee. - Physical Plant/Campus Energy System (PP)** ..... \$1,125  
Owns or manages a non-profit central district energy plant at a college, university, institution, research facility, hospital, airport, military base, etc. – entitled to 4 representatives
- Manufacturer/Supplier (MS)** ..... \$3,035  
Physically produces or sells equipment or supplies and materials for the industry, includes manufacturer’s representatives – entitled to 6 representatives
- Government, Non-Governmental Organizations or Associations (NPDG)** ..... \$500  
Non-profit, government or non-government organizations, trade or industry associations engaged in advocacy or education. “Government” applies to federal, state, provincial, municipal, or local governments or government agencies involved in evaluation, planning and/or policy related to District Energy. Does not include government-owned and/or operated district energy systems. – entitled to 2 representatives
- Service Providers to the Industry (Not Manufacturers or Equipment Suppliers)**  
Consultants, Consulting Engineering Firms, Attorneys, Investment Banks, Financial Institutions, Energy Service Companies, Manufacturer’s Representatives, etc.  
(Category is based on Annual Turnover or Gross Revenue of Parent Organization for previous calendar/fiscal year).
- (SS) < \$1,000,000 – entitled to 2 representatives** ..... \$900
- (SM) \$1,000,001 to \$4,999,999 – entitled to 4 representatives** ..... \$2,225
- (SL) > \$5,000,000 – entitled to 6 representatives** ..... \$3,200
- Additional Representative** ..... \$225 per individual
