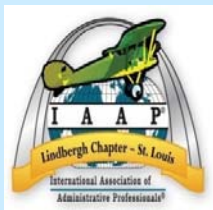
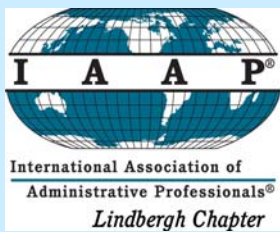

Remembering Armed Forces Day

May 15, 2010 will be the 60th Armed Forces Day. One day created to recognize the unification of the Armed Forces under one Department – The Department of Defense. This was a day of parades and celebrations to increase and educate the public's knowledge of the military, show new state of the art technology being used to protect them and our country. It was the day to honor all members of our Armed Forces. President Harry S. Truman, in an excerpt of his speech announcing the day, "...praised the work of the military services at home and across the seas." He pointed the Armed Forces were "vital to the security of the nation..."



Saturday, May 20, 1950, the first Armed Forces Day, was a celebration indeed. One I would equate to the size of a state fair. The celebration stretched across the nation and even reached across the great Atlantic. Thousands of servicemen paraded the streets while the community gathered together to honor our Armed Forces, as did the country's leaders.

We have parades for St. Patrick's Day, Mardi Gras, Thanksgiving, Christmas & New Year's Day but not Armed Forces Day. There are no parades, no outpour of support lining the streets, no flags waving, no children with the American Flag painted on their cheeks, no demonstrations to awe the crowd. Nothing to show the men and women of the Armed Forces appreciation for their service...their volunteered service. Amazing, the one department we should show our undying support of, the one department that protects your right to agree or disagree, allows us to have Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, St. Patrick's Day, MLK Day, 4th of July BBQs without fear of retribution goes un-noticed. Today, more than ever, we need to show our support of the Armed Forces. Showing your support to our military does not mean you are pro-violence or pro-war, it simply shows that you are pro-freedom. Please show your support through contribution, time and heart.

patriotic poke cake

WHAT YOU NEED!

- 2 baked round white cake layers (9 inch), cooled
- 2 cups boiling water, divided
- 1 pkg. (4-serving size) JELL-O Strawberry Flavor Gelatin, or any other red flavor
- 1 pkg. (4-serving size) JELL-O Berry Blue Flavor Gelatin
- 1 tub (8 oz.) Cool Whip Whipped Topping, thawed, divided

MAKE IT!

PLACE cake layers, top-sides up, in two clean 9-inch round cake pans. Pierce cakes with large fork at 1/2-inch intervals.

STIR 1 cup of the boiling water into each flavor dry gelatin mix in separate small bowls 2 min. until completely dissolved. Carefully pour red gelatin over 1 cake layer and blue gelatin over remaining cake layer. Refrigerate 3 hours.

DIP one cake pan in warm water 10 sec.; unmold onto serving plate. Spread with about 1 cup of the whipped topping. Unmold second cake layer; carefully place on first cake layer. Frost top and side of cake with remaining whipped topping. Refrigerate 1 hour or until ready to serve.
