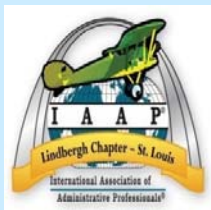
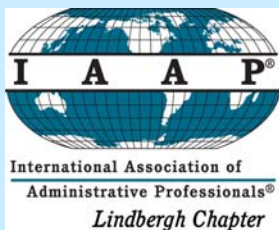

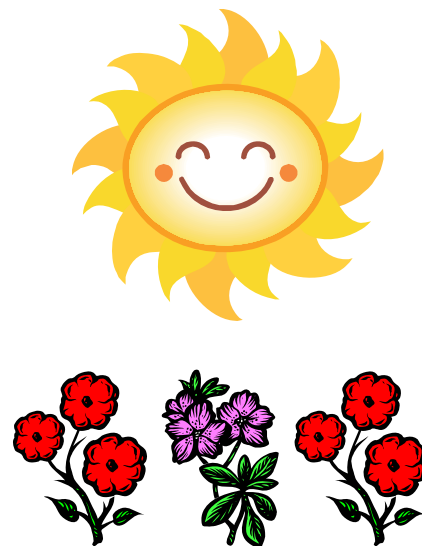

caramelized beef skewers

WHAT YOU NEED!

1 lb. beef sirloin steak, thinly sliced
 1/4 cup AI Original Steak Sauce, divided
 1/4 cup Kraft Original Barbecue Sauce
 1 tsp. Grey Poupon Dijon Mustard

MAKE IT!

HEAT grill to medium-high heat

WHAT YOU NEED!

1 pkg. (2-layer) yellow cake mix
 10 Oreo Cookies, divided
 3 cups thawed Cool Whip whipped topping
 5 Mini Oreo Bite Size Chocolate Sandwich Cookies
 7 Teddy Grahams Honey Graham Snacks

MAKE IT!

HEAT oven to 350°F

PREPARE cake batter as directed on package; pour into greased and floured 2-qt ovenproof bowl. Bake 1 hour or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in a bowl 15 min. Loosen cake from side of bowl, invert onto wire rack. Remove bowl; cool cake completely. Cut cake horizontally in half. Place flat layer on plate.

CRUSH 7 large Oreo cookies to form coarse crumbs; mix with Cool Whip. Spread 1 cup of the mixture onto cake layer on plate; top with remaining cake layer. Frost with remaining whipped mixture.

DECORATE with remaining ingredients as shown.

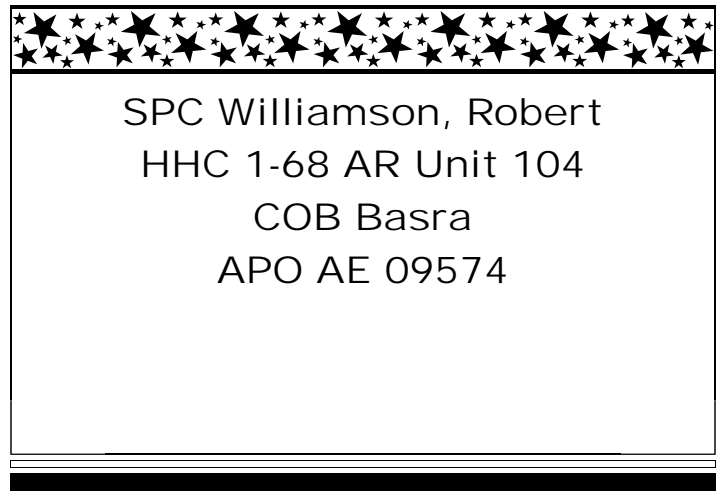
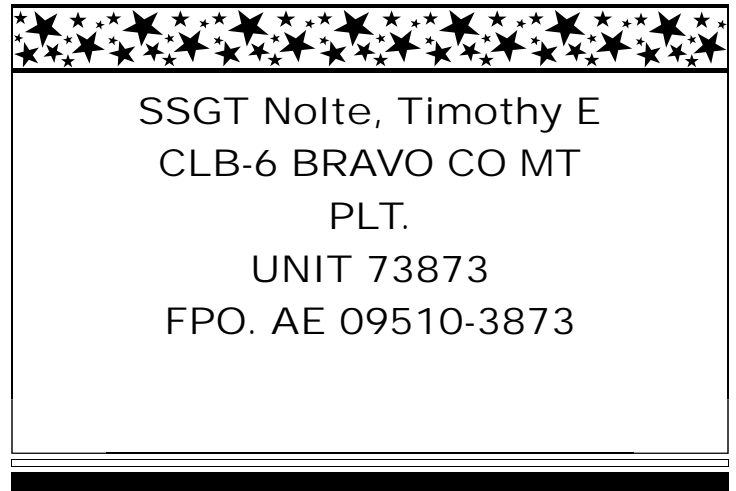
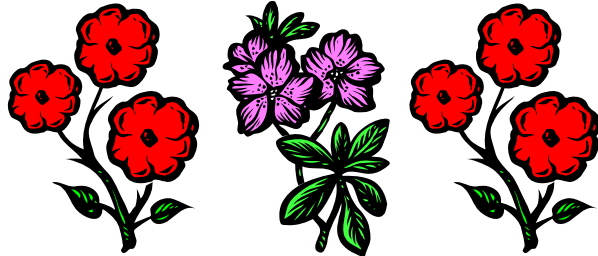
