Risk management is practiced in every business whether or not a formal risk management program is in place. In broad terms, risk management is the assessment of the variety of risks that a business may face followed by efforts to identify and take steps to minimize those risks so they will not present a significant impact. Risks may result from a variety of sources, for example, the operations conducted by the business, financial issues that may be encountered and even corporate image and reputation. This presentation will review the principles of risk management, the steps businesses take to address risks and discuss many of the types of risks that businesses prepare for today.

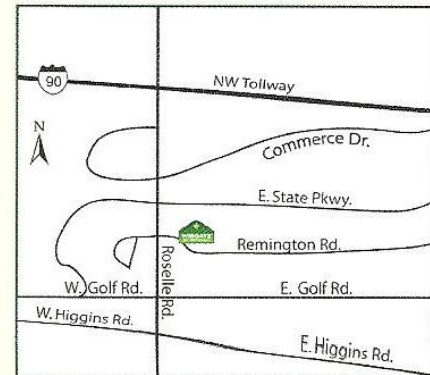
