Course overview

This one-day program offers local government practitioners a detailed analysis of the primary legislation affecting local government operations and has been developed by MacDonnells Law in close consultation with Queensland Water and IPWEAQ. The program will be presented in a practical format combining both seminar instruction and practice-based open discussion.

Designed for

Engineers and Council representatives working primarily in the area of town planning and water.

Suggested outcomes

The program has been developed to provide delegates with updates on legislation impacting on topical issues including powers of entry and access to infrastructure, enforcement of water rights, metering and levying of charges in addition to charging for the use of Infrastructure. It also seeks to deliver updates on integral Queensland legislation including the Local Government Act 2009, Water Act 2000, the Plumbing and Drainage Act 2000 and the newly enacted Water Supply (Safety and Liability) Act 2008 (Qld).

The challenges of ongoing drought and associated imposition of water restrictions make this program relevant to Councils in all regions. Local governments across the state are assessing their existing and future systems for water usage, infrastructure and regulation. With engineers playing a crucial role in this aspect of local government, an understanding of relevant laws is vital in responding to these crises.
