MCR 2.621 and 2.622 The New Playing Field for State Court Receiverships

Effective May 1, 2014, the Michigan Supreme Court amended MCR 2.621 and MCR 2.622. The new rules significantly change the process for the court's selection of the receiver, qualifications, appointment, duties, compensation and administration of receiverships. These changes were based upon recommendations made by members of the Receivership Committee of the Business Law Section of the State Bar of Michigan.

Hosted by the **Debtor/Creditor Rights Committee of the Business Law Section of the State Bar of Michigan** on June 10, 2014, this seminar explained the new rules and procedures, and it provided a view from the state court bench on receiverships.
