President – Pam Fortier



WHAT'S IN YOUR BAG?

Mary Wallis

EWGA Central Oregon has always been blessed with wonderful, highly dedicated volunteers who put forth a great deal of effort to make sure our members have the best golf and social experiences possible at a reasonable price. Our 2016 and 2017 Board President, Mary Wallis, is one of those. Mary joined EWGA CO in June of 2014, and in 2015 was elected to the Board as the Director of Events & Activities. She brought a fabulous amount of energy and enthusiasm to our Board and our Chapter, and to her efforts help make EWGA CO a great place for women golfers!



Mary has been playing golf for 23 years. She started playing with her now ex-husband, who had a 7 handicap. He thought the best way for her to learn golf was to just jump right into the courses he was playing, including Pebble Beach and Spanish Bay. At the time, Mary was working in high tech and living in the Bay Area and she was treated to great golf rounds by vendors who were wooing her company.

Originally from a rural area outside of Chicago, Ill, Mary's family relocated to Denver when she started Jr. High School. After attending the University of Colorado, Mary and her sister moved to California to start their careers. The Bay Area was her home for 36 years, but as the Bay Area grew more crowded and materialistic, Mary grew more contemplative and simple. So when her daughter started college, Mary and her partner, Seth, took the leap and started afresh in Bend.

If you have ever been paired with Mary, you know that she is a player who gets into her "zone" and plays amazing golf. She is one of the longer hitters in our Chapter. She has an eclectic bag of clubs, dominated by her King Cobra driver, a 6-iron for the fairway, and an 8-iron or pitching wedge to get her onto the green. If she's in the sand, she uses her Alien Sand Wedge that she won for being Closest to the Pin in a High Tech tournament. If she's in the water, she uses her Callaway ball retriever that her daughter gave her for Christmas. She just had new grips put on her 3-iron and 4-iron from an old set of Square Two Lady Rave clubs that she got back in 1999. In the late 1990's, Square Two clubs put out a nice set of ladies' golf clubs that featured the latest technology at the time. They were advertised in the now-defunct *Golf for Women* magazine, and readers could send away for an iron and wood to try out at a reasonable price. Back in the day, the full set could be had for around \$700.

For measuring distance, Mary prefers to pace off her distance from the course's yardage markers, but she also uses her Golf Buddy. One special item in Mary's bag is a ball marker from EWGA CO member Diane Kirpach, commemorating their round together at Pendleton's Wildhorse Golf Course. She also has a ball marker from Tammy Curtis, of EWGA Seattle, which was a thank you for organizing the wonderful Pacific Northwest 3-Day event.

Like many of us, Mary has struggled through the years to find a comfortable golf shoe that can withstand the rigors and challenges of Central Oregon golf courses. She now plays in her Hoka Hiking shoes, and enjoys their superior arch support and stability.

Her advice for newer golfers is to start with lessons, go practice what you learned, and get out and play! Forget about taking multiple swings on the course, and remember to adhere to Equitable Stroke Control and pick up your ball to advance play once you have hit your maximum number of strokes based on your Course Handicap.

Mary's favorite Central Oregon Course is Aspen Lakes, with its amazing views, fantastic staff, great price and the quality and challenge of the course. Aspen Lakes is a generous sponsor to EWGA CO. We can thank the hard work of members like Mary Wallis for the special treatment we all receive at Central Oregon courses. Through their efforts, EWGA CO has built a positive reputation with many local courses that ensures our members are welcome and honored when we come out to golf.

Mary's hope for the future of EWGA CO is to attract even more Central Oregon women who simply want to have fun together on the golf course, and to have a drink, laugh, and get to know each other after their round. Please join me in thanking Mary for her excellent volunteer work for our Chapter these last three years, and enjoy golfing with her for many years to come!
