### "OTHER GOLF"

I am often asked by new members, keen to meet other members and play golf, what opportunities exist in addition to the organized monthly golf event and weekly Saturday league play at Arrowhead. We basically maintain two 'lists of players' – those interested in playing weekdays, and those interested in playing weekends.

These lists are maintained by Mo White, and the first step is to get your name on either or both lists. To do so, simply send Mo an email ([mourinew@comcast.net](mailto:mourinew@comcast.net)) stating your preference.

How it works?? – Anyone wishing to play golf, sends an email to the appropriate list of recipients, stating where and when she proposes to play, and invites those interested in joining to respond by a given day/time. Upon receipt of the responses, the initiator calls the appropriate course to make the tee time(s), and advises the group accordingly.

Playing opportunities are endless from May 1 through October 31, via various discount/coupon books such as The Shark Shootout Players Pass, the ACE book, the Southwest Florida PGA Pass Book, etc. However, from January 1 through April 30 we are limited to those clubs willing to offer discounted/privileged rates to EWGA members. ### **NAPLERS CHAPTER ROSTER**

- Select 'DIRECTORY' (top line of the screen), and "Find a Member" from the drop down options.
- To see all members, leave the name fields blank, and select 'Chapter' from the 'Community Type' dropdowns, and 'Naples FL Chapter' from the 'Community Name' dropdowns.

All members' names will be displayed, together with a photograph if present, along with their city and state of residence, and their current employer/occupation. For each member, there will be displayed an option to 'Send Message'.

## PERCEPTION VERSUS REALITY

Eight common rules misconceptions debunked:

### 1. ADDRESSING THE BALL

**MISCONCEPTION** If your ball moves once you've taken your stance, it's a one stroke penalty, and the ball must be replaced.

**TRUTH** Unless you're in a hazard, you've not addressed the ball until you've taken your stance *and* grounded your club. If the ball moves before then, play it from its new position without penalty. In a hazard, once you've taken your stance, you've addressed the ball because you can't ground your club there.

### 2. ADVICE

**MISCONCEPTION** You can't ask or give any information about a hole to another golfer.

**TRUTH** Information on the Rules of Golf, distance or matters of public information such as the locations of hazards or the flagstick, is permissible.

### 3. HAZARD

**MISCONCEPTION** Stakes have to be visibly present for something to be considered a hazard.

**TRUTH** A hazard is any bunker or water hazard. Although sometimes not marked, a water hazard is any sea, pond, river, ditch, etc – even if it's dry. Ground your club and it's a 2 stroke penalty.

### 4. LINE OF PUTT

**MISCONCEPTION** You can't touch the putting surface beyond the hole on the line of your putt.

**TRUTH** It's a 2 stroke penalty to touch the line, but that only includes a reasonable distance on either side of the line between your ball and the hole – not beyond it.

### 5. OUT-OF-BOUNDS

**MISCONCEPTION** You can take a free drop from out-of-bounds markers (fences, walls, stakes).

**TRUTH** Course boundaries don't count as obstructions. The ball must be played as it lies or be deemed unplayable.

## 6. PROVISIONAL BALL

**MISCONCEPTION** You can hit a provisional ball at any time.

**TRUTH** You are not allowed to play a provisional ball unless you are virtually certain your ball is in a water hazard.

## 7. STROKE

**MISCONCEPTION** Once you start your downswing and your club crosses over the ball, it's a stroke even if you didn't hit it.

**TRUTH** A stroke is the forward movement of the club with the *intent* of striking and moving the ball. If you didn't intend to hit the ball, and the ball doesn't move, it's not a stroke no matter how far the club-head travels.



## 8. CONCEDED PUTT

**MISCONCEPTION** When a putt has been conceded, an attempt to putt out resulting in a miss, means the "gimme" has been forfeited and the extra putt has to be counted.

**TRUTH** After a putt has been conceded, it doesn't matter what you do to the ball : The concession can't be withdrawn or declined, and you're considered to have holed out with that stroke.

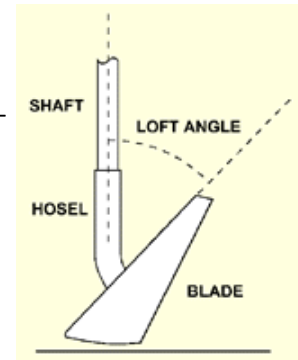


## LOFT LESSON 101

### WHAT IS THE LOFT of A GOLF CLUB?

The angle of the face of the club with respect to the shaft is called *loft*. Drivers, 2 and 3 irons have very little loft; wedges and short irons have considerable loft by design. And, as your intuition tells you, the more highly lofted a club is, the higher will be the trajectory of your ball.

Loft angles are expressed in degrees with respect to vertical rather than the ground. A high-lofted club, such as a sand wedge would have a loft somewhere about 55-degrees. Lob wedges can go as high as 64-degrees.



### WHAT IS THE OFFICIAL ALOFT ANGLE FOR EACH GOLF CLUB?

There aren't any official values. Manufacturers are free to set the angles to whatever they wish.

We can show you a chart indicating *nominal* loft angles for a modern set of irons. Realize that over the last forty years, manufacturers have *changed* these values considerably in order to make their models more attractive. By slightly reducing the loft angle of a club, the ball travels a bit farther. Distance sells.

The following are typical loft angles for a set of irons. However, there is *considerable* variability across manufacturers.

4-Iron 25	9-Iron 41
5-Iron 28	Pitching Wedge 45
6-Iron 31	Gap Wedge 50
7-Iron 34	Sand Wedge 55
8-Iron 37	Lob Wedge 60

You may find a chart in some book that shows different yardages. Nobody's values are "correct" for the following reasons.

Each club in a matched set of irons is designed to propel the ball a measured distance *compared to the other clubs in the set*. But the specific distance that each club propels the ball will vary from player to player, manufacturer to manufacturer, model to model, ball to ball. Even air temperature affects the flight of a ball. PGA Tour professional Phil Mickelson claims that a hot day can change the distance of his 7-iron from 175-yards to 185-yards.

It is not important that a nine-iron hits the ball a *specific distance*.

What *is* important is that once you figure out which iron *will* propel *your ball* a certain distance, that the other irons will propel the ball progressively further or less *by a predictable amount*.

All else being equal, distance is determined by the length of the shaft and the loft angle of the club-head.

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## HANDICAP CORNER - WHAT ARE ALL THOSE DOTS?

What the heck are all these dots on my scorecard??

If you have been playing at Arrowhead on Saturdays you will notice the official score cards have dots all over the place. More dots for some players than for others. The dots are not how much the people in the golf shop like you; they are according to your handicap.

Each hole on the golf course is assigned an allocated stroke number 1- 18. On the scorecard you will see a line for handicap. The hardest hole on the course is assigned 1 and the easiest 18. Even though you often may not agree with the rating of each hole, there is some formula I am sure, that determines this. Whatever your opinion, it is what it is according to the card. This allocated stroke number determines if you get strokes on a hole and if so, how many. This is all done according to your handicap.

Say your handicap is 18 (wishful thinking for a lot of us). You would simply get a stroke on every hole. Say your handicap is 9 (in my dreams) you would get a stroke on number 1 through 9, as those are the most difficult holes.

Why are there sometimes two dots you ask?

Say your handicap is 26 (now you're in my world). You get a stroke on every hole and then another stroke on the eight most difficult holes.

If you add up all the dots on the scorecard for a player, that should equal their handicap. Hope this helps.
