

serves as a liaison on the Board of Directors for the National Board for Certification of School Nurses.

In her remarks at NASN2017, Fekaris said, "The school nurse voice is more powerful than most of us realize. It is when we help a teacher understand how to alter lesson plans so students with food anaphylaxis can participate in all learning activities. It is when we teach children healthy habits, so they can grow and thrive." "The story of school nursing is what we do every day."

Fekaris added, "School nurses must recognize the importance of what we do, and recognize our own importance in carrying out this work. We (school nurses) are the health and wellness experts in the school, and we need to recognize and embrace this. We need to find our voice."

As the first semester of the 2017 – 2018 school year comes to a close, I want to THANK all Florida school nurses and extend

FASN best wishes for a safe and blessed holiday break. Many across our state are still struggling with recovery from Hurricane Irma and others are extending a helping hand to those who have been dis-

placed by Hurricane Maria. Your expertise in handling trauma and mental health needs has been invaluable to your school communities. The hard work that you, as health leaders, do every day to support the health and wellbeing of Florida's children has a direct and significant impact on students' academic success and future. FASN appreciates YOU!

This is my second year representing Florida on the board of the National Association of School Nurses (NASN) and my dedication to pro-

fessional school nursing has expanded to include membership on the NASN Executive Committee and chair of the Healthy Communities Strategic Committee. Directors from across the nation meet with NASN staff monthly to discuss how NASN's strategic plan continues to support the critical work of school nurses.

During the June 2017 board meeting, the NASN board of directors unanimously approved this statement: To optimize student health, safety and learning, it is the position of the National Association of School Nursing that a professional registered school nurse is present in every school all day, every day. This stance is congruent with the American Academy of Pediatrics recent (June 2016) policy statement recommending a minimum of one professional school nurse in every school and will be referenced in all future NASN position documents.

The NASN board of directors representing states from across the nation will meet again in February in our nation's capitol to review and approve revised documents, celebrate successes, and identify opportunities for growth and support. During the NASN

board of directors annual 'trip to the hill', I'll have an opportunity to discuss the legislative priorities of NASN and Florida school nurses with our state legislators. I am hopeful that by January, Congress will have enacted legislation to support the 400,000 Florida children covered by CHIP.

When we advocate for school nursing, we are advocating for a safe and supportive health environment

for all children in school. If we are to make a difference in the lives of our children, school nurses must begin courageous conversations with school boards, district leaders, and local legislators, armed with their county (or school) specific data. Reality check: It is estimated that one in four students in the U.S. may have a chronic health condition and Florida's state data support this estimate with 27% of our students reported as having a health condition such as asthma, diabetes, or life threatening allergy.

Students with chronic health conditions deserve access to a registered professional school nurse all day, every day to ensure health and safety.

Florida school districts must recognize that school nurses, as health leaders, are important members of their interdisciplinary support teams who can and do make a significant and sustainable contribution to students' academic success, and life long health. Given opportunity, time and access, FASN believes that Florida school nurses (YOU!) are uniquely positioned to help their communities identify and develop creative ideas, supports and partnerships committed to improving student health and access to care.
