

Upcoming Trainings School Nurse Orientations
August 15, 2018 in Salem 9am-4pm
August 22, 2018 in Portland 9am-4pm

The goal of this full day workshop is to equip school nurses with
the knowledge and skills to be a successful school health
services support for students and the larger school community.
Participants will engage in a variety of activities related to
content around the whole child, Oregon-specific issues, possible
health services challenges and solutions. The hope is that
participants leave feeling comfortable and confident in their role
as a support to the health and academic achievement of youth in
Oregon.

**The training is free; however, travel costs are not
reimbursed and lunch is not provided. Registration is
limited to 25 participants, with priority given to new school
nurses.**

After the training, new school nurses will be able to...

- Understand the Coordinated School Health and Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child Model and how health services plays a role in it;
- Become familiar with ODEs role in supporting school nurses within their school districts;
- Understand school nursing within the state of Oregon;
- Become familiar with the school policies and procedures most utilized/essential in day to day school nursing;
- Practice real- life scenarios to increase confidence and comfort in school nursing situations; and

8:30 **Pediatric Assessment with OHSU PNP Students** **Interactive discussion on pediatric assessment techniques**

This session will review pediatric assessment of common musculoskeletal injuries, respiratory problems, concussions and facilitation of intermittent catheterization of children with spinal cord defects.

- 1. identify and distinguish between musculoskeletal injuries that require further evaluation by a primary care or other provider and those that can be managed by the school nurse
- 2. perform a pediatric respiratory assessment to identify if child is responding to available therapies or needs further evaluation by primary care or emergency providers.
- 3. perform a neurological examination to determine whether a child needs further evaluation for a concussion or can return to play/school immediately
- 4. facilitate intermittent catheterization or self-catheterization of children in wheelchairs

9:40 **More than a Bandage: Health Information Resources for K-12 Health Professionals.**

This session will introduce free health information resources for K-12 health professionals provided by the National Library of Medicine (NLM). Participants will learn about consumer health sites covering general health, drug information, and environmental health, with an emphasis on MedlinePlus. These resources provide valuable information for newsletters, websites, social media, for policies and procedures regarding the health and well-being of students, parents, school staff and the wider community.

At the end of this session attendees will be able to:

1. Identify at least 3 consumer health resources from the National Library of Medicine
2. Begin to consider developing ways to share health resources with school staff and students and their families.
3. Recall at least one National Library of Medicine resource to use in your professional work.

The Oregon Department of Education will provide an overview of school-based Medicaid billing in the state of Oregon related to school nursing. The overview will include an update on the School Medicaid Billing Pilot Project (SB 111) as well as a review of recent changes and updates important to school nurses.

2:00 **Data is Your Friend: Telling the story of school nurses with Sasha Grenier, MPH, CHES, Sexual Health and School Health Specialist / Oregon Dept. of Education**

2:45 **Oregon Adolescent Snapshot with Wes Rivers**

The SNAPSHOT pulls information from across the Public Health Division to build a comprehensive understanding of the core components of adolescent health. The SNAPSHOT provides information on socioeconomic data and public policy interventions to provide greater context to health trends in different sub-populations of adolescents. The goal of the project is to provide stakeholders and youth with meaningful data that can be used to identify disparities and create more targeted policy and programming.

1. Audience will gain a greater understanding of trends in adolescent health and health behavior, health disparities in different adolescent subpopulations, and socioeconomic and policy context for these trends and disparities.
