



TOUR: Willamette Falls & Sullivan Power Plant

As the U.S. entered the electric age, the 30 to 40 feet of water height, at Willamette Falls was a natural for power generation, and the location was promoted as the “Niagara Falls of the West.” The facility opened on the West Linn side of Willamette Falls in 1895 and later took the name of the PGE hydraulic engineer who designed the station, Thomas W. Sullivan.
