About “Lessons Learned in Cost Analysis:”

A panel will present a review of lessons learned in preparing cost analyses for marine projects from both the government and commercial market perspectives. Practical do's and don'ts will be presented along with antidotal examples.

Biographies:

Moderator - Mr. Steve Morris has over 25 years experience in the areas of marine operations, ship construction, ship repair, fleet fuel management and senior financial management, both domestically and internationally. He has served as the Chief Financial Officer of two cruise lines and project director for a third. Currently, he is the Senior Project Manager for BMT's Designers & Planners unit in Arlington, VA leading the cost analysis group. He has supported various ship building programs for the U.S. Coast Guard, U.S. Navy, NOAA and MARAD. Additionally, *Mr. Morris* advises senior clients in matters related to practical, effective implementation of shipboard environmental systems and fuel efficiency improvement initiatives. Mr. Morris has a BE and MS in Engineering as well as an MBA, earned respectively at the University of Pennsylvania and New York University.

Panelist - Mr. Matthew Dean started his career as a government cost analyst with Navy's Office of Special Projects in Arlington, VA. In this role, he was responsible for providing cost and economic analysis to Navy decision makers for various naval acquisition programs. Retired from civil service in 1996, he joined BearingPoint's federal practice and as a Senior Manager, provided guidance to customers on topics including project management processes, acquisition documentation and cost and economic analysis. *Mr. Dean* is currently President of MARKON, Inc., a growing management consulting company with clients in the DoD and the U.S. Intelligence Community. He has a BS in Industrial Engineering from Virginia Tech and a MS in Engineering Management from University of Maryland.

Panelist - Mr. Nick Koreisha is an independent consult who has worked with government agencies and corporate decision makers in the maritime and defense industries for over 30 years.
