

Teacher of the Year Award Guidelines

Deadline Posted on AAFCS Website

The AAFCS National Teacher of the Year award was established in 1974 to recognize exemplary teachers who utilize cutting-edge methods, techniques, and activities to provide stimulus and visibility to family and consumer sciences in elementary and secondary education.

Applying for the Teacher of the Year Award

- The Applicant must be a professional member of AAFCS (a) at the time of submission; (b) at the time of the annual conference; and (c) three (3) consecutive years immediately prior to this submission.
- The Applicant has taught the submitted program a minimum of two previous years and the current year.
- The Applicant is employed as a full-time, permanent Family and Consumer Sciences (FCS) teacher in grades kindergarten through 12 (K-12) or a full-time permanent FCS teacher who has retired within twelve months of the AAFCS National Nomination deadline.
- The nomination is made by the affiliate president or awards committee chair. Each affiliate may nominate one teacher for the award.
- Nomination materials are prepared by the applicant.
- Applicants can submit to only one AAFCS award, grant, fellowship, or scholarship per annual review cycle.
- Members of the AAFCS Board of Directors and Awards and Recognition Committee are not eligible to apply during their terms of office. AAFCS staff are not eligible to apply during their periods of employment with the Association.
- All award materials must be submitted in English.
- All policies, procedures, and guidelines must be followed for the award nomination to be considered for juried review.

Submitting the Application

The application must be submitted using the official application form and in the order below as one PDF document. Please be aware of the page requirements for each section. Please include page numbers and headings. The online application will require submission of a color headshot photo of applicant that will be used in marketing and promotional materials. Please keep a copy of all materials submitted to AAFCS. Questions should be forwarded to awards@aafcs.org.

Section 4: FCS Curriculum Focus (Maximum of 8 pages in 12-point font)

The curriculum focus includes an original, expanded, or substantially modified traditional FCS content area, or, a teaching emphasis consistently embedded in the applicant's curriculum. **Please note** that while external links to websites may be listed, the content in those links will not be reviewed. All supporting documents must be included in the eight pages.

- A. **Description**: Describe how your FCS Curriculum Focus exhibits creativity, innovation, and cutting-edge techniques and alignment with State or FCS National Standards.
- B. **School/Community Setting**: Briefly describe the school/community and the FCS Department. The description should include the school enrollment, total FCS enrollment, and the enrollment for at least the past three years within the nominated curriculum focus area.
- C. **Goals and Outcomes**: Describe goals, outcomes and program sustainability in narrative, list and/or graphic form.

D. Impact Statements:

- a. Student Impact: Provide evidence that the curriculum focus has had a positive influence on students' lives during and beyond the duration of the curriculum focus.
- b. FCS Impact: Describe how the curriculum focus increases visibility, growth, recognition, appreciation of, and support for FCS in the school and community.
- c. School/Community Impact: Describe how this curriculum focus has had a relevant and timely impact on the school and/or community needs.
- E. **Funding and Challenges**: Describe how the applicant used ingenuity and perseverance to obtain, maximize, and sustain funding and/or overcome obstacles or challenges.
- F. **Supporting Documents**: Incorporate supporting items in <u>readable</u> scale such as photographs/drawings, figures/tables, and media clippings et al., which illustrate and further explain the curriculum focus.

Section 5: Letters of Support (Each Letter Limited to Maximum of One Page)

• Two Letters of Support from persons such as supervisor, colleague, parent, student, educational partner or community leader that give evidence of the impact and importance of the applicant's contributions to students, families, and the community.

Evaluating the Teacher of the Year Application

- Individuals who apply for an Award and those who nominate or write a letter of recommendation for a current applicant cannot serve as jurors for this award.
- Jurors cannot review applications from family members, their current students, students at their own institution, or applicants who share the same employer. Jurors are responsible for identifying any applicants that include a potential conflict of interest and recusing themselves from the review process.
- An individual who has been nominated and/or applied for an award, grant, fellowship, or scholarship shall not serve as a juror for any award, grant, fellowship, or scholarship during the period in which his or her own application is being reviewed.
- Jurors selected by the AAFCS Awards and Recognition Committee review the application and assign points using the Evaluation Criteria.

Awarding the Teacher of the Year Award

- One AAFCS National Teacher of the Year and up to two merit finalists will be selected.
- The recipient(s) will be notified in the spring and will be honored during the AAFCS Annual Conference.
- The Awards and Recognition Committee reserves the right not to choose a recipient for an award, grant, fellowship, or scholarship if jurors do not find a worthy applicant.
- Recipients are eligible to receive the National Teacher of the Year Award or be recognized as a merit finalist or an affiliate Teacher of the Year more than once if the outstanding program for which the teacher is currently nominated differs from the one for which the same teacher was formerly recognized.
- AAFCS members can be the National Teacher of the Year only once with the current nominated program.
- Merit finalists and affiliate nominees may apply, for a second time, with the current nominated program, if nominated again by their affiliate.

Recognizing the National Teacher of the Year and Merit Finalists

- The National Teacher of the Year recipient must attend the AAFCS Annual Conference to be recognized and to receive the \$2,500 monetary award. The National Teacher of the Year recipient will also be reimbursed up to \$1,000 to support one year of AAFCS membership and participation in the AAFCS Annual Conference.
- The AAFCS National Teacher of the Year is expected to promote/present their program at the Community of Elementary, Secondary, and Adult Education (ESAE) Curriculum Showcase during the AAFCS Annual Conference. The awardee shall also participate in any programs as requested by AAFCS.
- In addition to the awardee's responsibilities at the conference, the awardee may be asked to serve as a representative for Family and Consumer Sciences Education and AAFCS throughout the year as the National Teacher of the Year.
- Merit finalists and Affiliate nominees will be recognized at the AAFCS Annual Conference. Attendance is not mandatory. Reimbursement is not provided to attend the conference.
- Merit finalists and Affiliate nominees are expected to promote/present their Teacher of the Year programs during the Community of ESAE Curriculum Showcase.

Failure to follow the guidelines will result in ineligibility of the nominee for the award.

Evaluation Criteria

The following criteria correspond with the National Teacher of the Year guidelines and provide clarification, ease in preparing the nomination materials, and consistency in judging.
