Becoming certified is the most credible credential a family and consumer sciences professional can achieve. The AAFCS Certification Program provides the following exclusive benefits:

Who Can Complete the Exam?

Those individuals who hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution or who will graduate within the year are eligible to take one of the five professional-level assessments offered by AAFCS.

- 3. If you have a MYAAFCS account click the "Register" button and log in with your username and password. (If you <u>do not</u> have a MYAAFCS account click the "Create a profile" link. Complete your profile and click **Submit**.)
- 4. Click the Register button for the Paper Based Testing Wisconsin Affiliate Conference event.
- 5. Complete the **Badge and Contact Information** and **Event Specific Information** sections and click **Continue** (Please Note: Date of Birth, Gender, and Ethnicity are required fields.)
- 6. Complete the **Registration Options** section and click **Continue**.
- 7. Select an exam by clicking **Add** in the Actions column. Then, click **Continue** in the Itinerary box.
- 8. Review your exam information and click **Continue**.
- 9. Scroll down to the **Payment Information** section to enter your payment details and click **Submit**.

What We Are Offering To Our Members



Need a little extra support to attend this year's WAFCS Annual Conference? In light of financial constraints in many school districts, teachers are often limited in the amount of time that can be spent out of the classroom for professional development activities. It has been pointed out that the availability of funds to pay for a substitute teacher could be the difference in having some of our teaching members be able to attend our conference or not. The Foundation addresses this concern by offering three stipends of up to \$125 to support classroom teacher attendance at the WAFCS Annual Conference. Recipients will be reimbursed after conference attendance and submission of appropriate expense documentation.

WAFCS Service Project by Cathy Lader



WAFCS leadership has selected a 2021-2022 Service Project and encourage all members to participate. Members will be sewing, or helping to construct, pillow cases for children in Wisconsin who are hospitalized due to injuries or illness. "Ryan's Cases for Smiles" is a volunteer organization that was founded in 2007. They started with a simple goal: to create and distribute whimsical pillowcases that give children an emotional boost and remind them that they are not defined by their illness. As of today over 2,300,000 pillowcases have been distributed to hospitalized children and their families. WAFCS will donate member's pillow cases to this volunteer organization.

"Ryan's Case for Smiles" has moved beyond the original goal of pillow cases and now provides valuable resources for families with hospitalized children. To ensure the highest quality of resources and care, "Ryan's Case for Smiles" has partnered with PTSD (Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder) experts at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and Nemours/Alfred I. DuPont Hospital for Children to create valuable web-based information and tools designed for each member of the family's unique experience. Gimme Five



The goal is for every WAFCS member to sew, or be responsible for, five pillow cases by the 2022 WAFCS Annual Conference in early March. Pillow cases will be collected at the conference. For every five pillow cases completed a "HI FIVE" will be posted – virtually and in-person. So get ready to HI FIVE each other by participating in this service project. In the event a member will not be able to attend the annual conference alternate delivery arrangements will be made.

The pillow case pattern is included as part of this newsletter. The follow guidelines are provided by "Ryan's Case for Smiles":

- •Use 100% cotton fabric. Please do not use fabric with glitter.
- •Remember to use fun, colorful novelty prints.
- •Due to CoVID-19 restriction at partner hospitals, at this time, they are asking for fabric/pillow cases not to be laundered.

You may sew the pillow cases or decide to host a "sew in" with members and/or friends. You may form a partnership with a local FCCLA Chapter or secondary FCS program to collaborate on this project. This could be an opportunity for mentors to spend time with their new FCS professionals as they create pillow cases.

"Hot Dog" Approach to Sewing a Pillowcase

Supplies:

- Fun, bright fabric with kid-friendly designs
 - 1/3 yard of border fabric (this will be the "bun")
 - 3/4 yard of main pillowcase fabric (this will be the "hot dog")
- Spool of thread that matches fabric

Preparation:

- Cut the "bun" into a strip that's 10 ½ inches by 40 ½ inches
- Cut the "hot dog" in a strip that's 26 ½ inches by 40 ½ inches

9 Step Process:

Step 1:

With the border of the pillowcase laying right side up on the surface in front of you, take the body of the pillowcase and place it right side down on top of the border.

Step 2:

Match up the corners of the short 26 ½" end of the body to the 40 1/2" end of the border, so that you can no longer see the border in front of you. Make sure to keep the two edges of the fabrics together for the next few steps.

Step 3:

Roll up the other short end of the body until you are about an inch or two away from the other end.

Step 4:

You should see the other end of the border peeking out from underneath the body. Take that edge of the border and fold it over the rolled-up body aligning its corners with the other two pieces of fabric on the other side.
