Through the FCS Day initiative, AAFCS provides information, tools and research on the benefits of families/cohesive groups preparing and eating healthy meals together. It has been a Wisconsin tradition to have high participation. This year it will look a bit different due to Covid 19.

Past participants have included FCS classrooms, campus organizations, dorm/apartment residents, office staff, friends and families in communities of all sizes. Using these groups as inspiration, we can rethink how to dine safely while following recommended Covid 19 Guidelines:

Foundation Awarded Reimbursement Scholarships for AAFCS Virtual Conference Registration

The WAFCS Foundation offered "Reimbursement Scholarships" to reimburse up to 20 professional member registrations (at \$100 each) and up to 40 student registrations (at \$25 each) for the 2020 AAFCS Virtual Annual Conference. 
