Recap of "Wanted: FCS Teacher Educators, Tips for Career Ladder Climbers and Coaches" Written by Caiping Su



At the AAFCS 2025 conference, a panel discussion titled "Wanted: FCS Teacher Educators –Tips for Career Ladder Climbers and Coaches" featured insights from Susan Turgeson, Janine Duncan, and Nicole Graves.

Turgeson and her fellow panelists focused on providing valuable insights and strategies for those aspiring to advance in the field of Family and Consumer Sciences (FCS) education. Susan Turgeson, an esteemed educator and panelist, shared her expertise on navigating the career ladder in this rewarding but challenging field. She emphasized the importance of mentorship, continuous professional development, and fitting individual professional interests with the institution's situations regarding teaching, research, and service, suggesting that both emerging educators and seasoned professionals remain adaptable and influential in shaping the future of FCS education.

Attendees left with actionable tips on how to enhance their teaching practices, foster professional growth, and effectively navigate career advancement as classroom teachers, extension educators, and teacher educators.
