

- **Dr. Williams** started as an FCCLA member, competing in STAR Events. Her career pathway is loaded with a variety of FCS occupations including spending three summers working in Cuba developing restaurant concepts. Delores is excited to travel to Wisconsin where she has fond childhood memories from summer visits.
- Dr. Williams has mentored thousands, developed community-based programs, launched mobile STEM labs, and consults with leaders—her mission remains the same: to turn passion into progress and vision into victory.
- Driven by faith, fueled by purpose, and rooted in community, Dr. Williams is not just planting seeds, she's cultivating a more equitable and inspired future for generations to come.
- Elena Terry is the Executive Chef/Founder of Wild Bearies, a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing and educating about Indigenous foods and the culture around those foods.
- Chef Elena was a guest chef on the popular Bravo TV show Top Chef that aired on May 15, 2024. She described the experience as "a transformative moment". Along with a colleague from Minnesota they cooked a meal for the remaining contestants educating them on the importance of food in Native cultures. Since then, she has served as a mentor and guest judge for the 21st season of Top Chef.
- Chef Elena has developed partnerships with James Beard Foundation, the Smithsonian, Food and Agriculture Organization to the United Nations, US State Department, Intertribal Agriculture Council, American Indian Foods Program, Advocates for Urban Agriculture, and UW System to name a few.

Overview of Resource:

Google's Applied Digital Skills is a free, project-based digital curriculum designed to teach practical technology skills using real-world scenarios. Lessons cover topics such as communication, goal setting, spreadsheets, presentations, and problem-solving, all taught through short instructional videos

and hands-on activities. The program is tailored for a wide range of learners—from middle schoolstudents to adults—and aligns well with 21st-century workplace and college readiness skills.

Each lesson includes step-by-step instructions, downloadable lesson plans, and opportunities for self-paced learning, which makes it flexible for diverse classroom settings. Because the program is web-based and free, students can access it anywhere, promoting collaboration and independent work both inside and outside of class.

Reflection:

I use Applied Digital Skills in my College & Career Readiness class to build both digital literacy and professional communication skills. One favorite activity is the "Goal-Setting Emails" lesson, which teaches students to write clear, professional messages while planning their academic and career goals. The fact that the program is free makes it especially appealing for educators, and its real-world context keeps students engaged. The self-guided videos allow me to provide individualized support while they work, making it a valuable tool for preparing students for college and workplace expectations.

"SketchUp is a powerful yet accessible 3D modeling tool that fits seamlessly into high school Housing and Interior Design courses. It allows students to design interior and architectural spaces in a digital environment, helping them visualize room layouts, furniture placement, and structural features with precision. For teachers, SketchUp offers a practical way to bring design concepts to life without needing advanced software experience. Its intuitive interface makes it easy for students to start building right away, using drag-and-drop features, measurement tools, and a large library of pre-made models.

SketchUp for Schools is free, web-based, and integrates well with Google Workspace, making it a convenient option for classrooms using Chromebooks or other cloud-based systems. Beyond its classroom applications, SketchUp introduces students to industry-standard tools that are used in interior design, architecture, and construction fields. Integrating it into lessons not only enhances creativity and critical thinking but also builds technical skills that support early career exploration. From creating dream bedrooms to planning functional living spaces, SketchUp encourages students to apply what they've learned in a way that feels both relevant and real-world.

A former student who attends Western Technical College and is majoring in Architectural Technology introduced this resource to me, and I now use it in my Housing & Interior Design course. We have found it works best with a physical mouse, but works fine with a track pad or touchscreen. Happy creating!!"
