



This job aid will walk you through the process for updating your program information listed for applicants in ERAS Account Maintenance (EAM). This information may include general information, requirements, deadlines, description of patient populations, curricular/training opportunities, and/or any other unique opportunities available. Applicants will see this information prior to applying to your program.

1. Navigate to [ERAS Account Maintenance \(EAM\)](#) and enter your login ID and password




2. Provide contact Information (full name, email address, and contact phone). This will be only used by ERAS Staff. Next, review and agree to the terms and conditions




