

- Increase the number of master 's-level marriage and family therapists trained in advanced practitioner skills committed to serving communities, including children, adolescents, and young adults (aged 16-25) in the United States.
- Increase the number of doctoral-level marriage and family therapists with advanced practitioner skills who are committed to advancing mental health, substance use, and prevention services in communities.
- Collaborate with appropriate mental health providers, training programs, and affiliated organizations to improve mental health, substance use, and prevention services to communities.

Doctoral Stipends

- Fellows may be awarded an Educational Stipend of around \$20,000 for Doctoral Fellows (DFs) and \$16,000 for Dissertation Completion Fellows (DCFs)*.

- Fellows may be awarded an Educational Stipend of around \$12,000 for Masters (MFP-Y) Fellowship.
- Stipends tied to deliverables.
- Schedule of payments


Technical Proficiency and Use of AI

- Fellows are encouraged to develop technical proficiency with productivity and data management tools such as Microsoft Office Suite (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook) or comparable software.
- All Fellow work will be reviewed for originality and appropriate use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools. Assignments must reflect the student's own critical thinking and writing, with proper citation of any AI assistance used in the development or creation of the work.
- A standard academic threshold of 20% similarity will be applied when assessing originality.
 - Submissions that exceed this benchmark or fail to acknowledge AI-generated contributions will be subject to disciplinary action, including restrictions and eligibility for coursework or program participation.
- Assignments will be labeled, Allow AI or AI Use Not Permitted

 - Student presentations on research
 - **Note** Fellows with an exemption/excused absence from the Training Institute Quantitative Workshop will have opportunities to participate in alternative training by:
 - Reviewing the presentation materials from the event.
 - Reviewing the recorded version of the 2026 TI Workshop(s).
 - Practice running the data models with materials/tools provided by Dr. Soloski and the MFP.
 - Participating in alternate training options on the day of the event (in past years: Fellowship Roundtable).

Research Expectations

Research projects focus around: Training Doctoral Fellows to practice, develop, and disseminate research that will increase their scholarly basis in behavioral and mental health. Their scholarly work and publications help to bridge the gap between academia and the community while filling gaps in the literature

All Fellows will:

- 1. Begin or continue work (provided it meets MFP goals) on a research project. (MFP Director must approve the title of research)
 - a. Proposal must include quantitative analysis.
- 2. Continue working on this research from **December 2025 to July 2026.**
- 3. Completion of the final project and delivery will be in quarter 4 and not at the Training Institute.

Research Expectations (Cont.)

- 4. Participate in one-on-one consultations with a statistical and methodology expert around quantitative research related to the above project/poster.
- 5. Research Requirements:
 - a.Research design cannot contain DEI, social justice, or harmreduction frameworks
 - b.Research cannot focus on a specific population or compare one population to another population. Population databases must have broad community representation.

Dissertation Expectations

Research projects focus around: Training Doctoral (and Dissertation) Fellows too practice, develop, and disseminate research that will increase their scholarly basis in behavioral and mental health. Their scholarly work and publications help to bridge the gap between academia and the community while filling gaps in the literature

All DCF Fellows MUST:

- 1. Be sure that the dissertation will fit with the MFP goals and mission.
- 2. Dissertations cannot focus on a specific population or compare one population to another.
- 3. The dissertation cannot contain DEI, social justice, or harm-reduction frameworks.
- 4. Dissertation must be approved by the dissertation committee and submitted via email (MFP inbox) by December 15, 2025. There are no exceptions to this requirement.





Increasing Self-Awarness in MFT

Building the Mentorship relationship is important and must start with a sold foundation. The Fellow must make sure to contact mentors and establish a first connection. The MFP recommends using a teleconferncing or face-to-face application for the first meeting. While meeting be open, honest, and showing integrity.

- 1) discuss your background, experiences, interests, expectations
- make a schedule for frequency of contact (once a month to start) and method of contact
- 3) set preliminary goals of how the mentor relationship can be beneficial
- 4) Ask about your mentor's background, and any struggles he/she/they might have had in their career

Increasing Direction and Professional Development

Once trust has been built, now will be the time to set goals of professional development for the year with the mentor. The goal is to build a foundation that will set the stage for the mentor to identify resources and work towards engagement with MFT and behavioral health professionals.

Increasing Engagement in MFT

During the final stages of the mentorship program, the mentee should evaluate the goals and their progression throught the mentorship program. The mentee should be able to identify other indicuduals and platforms that will help foster growth during academic and career transitions.
