Duck-Hee Kang Memorial Mentored Workshop for Early Career Nurse Scientists

Duck-Hee Kang, PhD, RN, FAAN (1947-2016) was a biobehavioral nurse scientist, teacher, mentor, and friend who contributed greatly to the advancement of science, the nursing profession, her colleagues, and her students. This workshop is presented in her memory.

Overview: This one-day workshop, presented by the Early Career Special Interest Group of the Council for the Advancement of Nursing Science (CANS), offers an opportunity for research mentoring between senior research nurse scientists (faculty) and competitively selected, research doctorally prepared (PhD, DNSc, research doctorate) early career nurse scientist (postdoctoral and new faculty) participants. It will be held on Tuesday, October 22, 2019 prior to the CANS Advanced Methods Conference.

Description: This program will offer participants the opportunity to receive critique on an initial submission research grant (R level (e.g. R21, R01)) proposal and participate as a member of a NIH-style mock review panel. Participants may submit an R level proposal seeking funding from sources other than governmental. During the daylong experience, the senior faculty will serve as primary reviewers for two grants and secondary reviewers for two grants. Early-career participants will be expected to serve as secondary reviewers for all applications except their own.

Program Objectives: At the completion of the Duck-Hee Kang Memorial Mentored Workshop, participants will be able to:

1. Demonstrate the ability to critique and score research proposals per NIH guidelines.
2. Utilize critique and comments on research grant proposal in revising application for submission to funding source.
3. Submit a final proposal to participant selected funding source within 12 months of workshop completion.

Early-Career Participants: Up to six participants will be selected by the Duck-Hee Kang Memorial Mentored Workshop Advisory Group of CANS, which is comprised of senior research faculty and prior workshop participants. Participants selected for the workshop will be notified by **June 6, 2019**.

Eligibility:

1. Current member in good standing of the Council for the Advancement of Nursing Science.
2. Nurse scientist with PhD, DNSc, or other (research doctorate) within the past 5 years (conferred in 2014 or later).
3. Has not achieved tenure and/or R01 level funding as a primary investigator.
4. Proposal must be relevant to nursing research, with preference given to proposals that address one of the following foci: biobehavioral science, CANS research priorities (precision health, determinants of health, global health, big data).
5. Submit cover sheet, letter of intent, and NIH Biosketch by May 8, 2019.

Application Procedures: (Note: Applications which do not adhere to the page limits for the Letter of Intent or the Biosketch, or include a CV, will not be reviewed.)

The following items are required:

1. Cover Sheet (Please use template provided).
2. Letter of Intent (Max 2 pages; Font: Arial size 11; ½ inch margins) that includes:
 - a. Affirmation that you will:
 - i. Submit an R-level proposal to be presented to and reviewed by the workshop attendees by the due date of October 1, 2019.
 - ii. Attend and actively participate in all components of the workshop in person in Washington, DC on October 22, 2019.
 - b. Description of the proposed research – including the focus of the research and the CANS specific research priority that the research addresses.
 - c. Previous funding that supports this application.
 - d. Pilot work that has been completed that supports this application.
 - e. Explanation of how attendance at the workshop would benefit your application.
3. NIH Biosketch (maximum of 5 pages; [follow NIH guidelines](#)).

Application Deadline: Wednesday, May 8, 2019 at 11:59 ET.

Cost/Expenses:

1. CANS will provide airfare reimbursement up to \$500 for travel to Washington, DC.
2. Participants will secure funding from their employing institution for hotel, parking, meals, airport transportation and luggage fees incurred for the workshop (October 22, 2019) or will agree to self-fund expenses other than airfare.
3. CE credits will be provided for the workshop.
4. No registration fees will be charged to attend the workshop.

Selected Participant Expectations:

1. Invited participants will utilize the application instructions provided when asked to submit a full research grant proposal by October 1, 2019 at 11:59 p.m. ET.
2. Sign a confidentiality statement prior to receiving access to the proposals of other participants.
3. Provide written review of other participants' proposals to workshop organizers two weeks prior to attending the workshop.
4. Attend the workshop in its entirety on Tuesday, October 22, 2019.
5. Note the strengths and weaknesses of your proposal as discussed in the mock review session to discuss with faculty.
6. Actively participate in mock reviews of proposals of other participants.
7. Upon conclusion of the workshop, have a plan and timeline to revise and submit your research grant proposals to an identified research funding source.
8. Complete an evaluation of the workshop and participate in the focus group to evaluate the process.
9. Submit the revised proposal to the selected funding source by October 2020.
10. Respond to follow-up requests for updates and outcomes from the workshop.
