



Associate/Full Research Professor – Community Health

The School of Nursing at Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey is seeking candidates and referrals for a senior research faculty position in Community Health, with specialization in social determinants of health, and health disparities, as related to human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and other infectious diseases. This is a calendar year position at the rank of Associate Professor or full Professor with tenure.

The successful candidate will join the François-Xavier Bagnoud (FXB) Center within Rutgers School of Nursing as a senior scientist, collaborating in the overall leadership and development of the Center's research and evaluation efforts.

The FXB Center is committed to improving the health of vulnerable women, children, youth, and families—including those infected and affected by HIV— and to building capacity in the communities and systems that serve them. With \$36 million in annual grant funding and approximately 350 staff, the FXB Center has a 30-year track record of successfully competing for sponsored programs from city, state, and federal agencies.

The FXB Center has a long history of providing prevention services, care, and treatment for people living with HIV and their families, and offering innovative health care provider training and technical assistance locally, nationally, and globally. It has served as a national resource center for federally funded, national programs including the AIDS Education and Training Centers (AETC), 2002-present; and as a national organization supporting the CDC's Expert Panel on HIV Reproductive Health and Preconception Care, 1999-present. The FXB Center also is a New Jersey local partner of the Northeast/Caribbean AETC and is funded by the NJ Department of Health to provide continuing education and technical assistance to health care providers working in the field of HIV. The Center has an extensive portfolio of formal agreements and partnerships with major federal agencies and several universities.

- Earned doctorate in nursing or health-related field such as psychology, public health, or social work;
- Eligible for appointment at Associate or full Professor rank with tenure;
- Distinctive record of research, publications, and extramural funding focused on community health, with specialization in social determinants of health, health disparities, as related to human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and other infectious diseases; and
- Track record of successful collaboration with interdisciplinary teams.
