November 6: The Academy submitted comments to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) regarding the proposed rule on Medicare and Medicaid Programs: Minimum Staffing Standards for Long-Term Care Facilities and Medicaid Institutional Payment Transparency Reporting. The Academy's comments highlighted considerations for improving the registered nurse (RN) on-site requirement, establishing nurse staffing standards, transparency of Medicaid nursing home information, and provisions on strengthening facility assessment requirements. November 3: The Council for the Advancement of Nursing Science (CANS) and the Academy sent a letter to the National Institute of Nursing Research (NINR) regarding their **request for information on advancing nursing research in climate and health**. Family caregivers provide the vast majority of services and supports for older adults and persons with disabilities. Caregivers represent all segments of society and all demographic groups, with over 61% of family caregivers employed outside of their caregiving responsibilities. The demand for family caregivers remains on the rise and these caregivers are somewhat invisible in our communities, our workplaces, health systems, and society. One in five households in the US are providing care and support to a person over 18. Over 53 million family members and friends are in this important role and this is a family experience across all generations and racial and ethnic groups. The Academy has been on the record urging policymakers to increase access to high-quality care for older Americans and support for family caregivers and long-term care workers. The Academy continues to emphasize

nurses' vital role in advancing support for family caregivers and providing national recommendations to support family caregivers through our policy work. Below are policy actions the Academy has taken to support family caregivers:

- The Academy signed onto a <u>letter</u> thanking President Biden for **prioritizing efforts to support family caregivers through** <u>Executive Order 14095</u> and urging him to turn the <u>2022 National Strategy to Support Family Caregivers</u> from the bipartisan Recognize, Assist, Include, Support, and Engage (RAISE) Family Caregivers Act (<u>Public Law 115-119</u>) into meaningful action by ensuring federal agencies follow through on their commitments.
- Members of the Academy's <u>Aging Expert Panel</u> authored an article published in Nursing Outlook entitled "<u>Categorizing national caregiver recommendations to support family caregivers and address unmet needs.</u>"
- The Academy's <u>Aging Expert Panel</u> hosted a policy dialogue on <u>Advancing Policies to Support Family Caregivers</u>.
- The Academy released a <u>Position Statement on Policies to Support Family Caregivers in Nursing Outlook</u>. This position statement supported paid family and medical leave and the RAISE Family Caregivers Act (<u>Public Law 115-119</u>).
- The Academy joined over 630 organizations in signing on to a <u>letter</u> supporting the **Family and Medical Insurance Leave (FAMILY) Act (<u>H.R.1185/S.463</u>). This legislation would create a national family and medical leave insurance program to help ensure people who work can take the time they need to address serious health and caregiving needs.**
