January 28: The Academy sent a <u>press release</u> applauding President Biden's Executive Orders to accelerate the vaccine rollout, increase personal protective equipment (PPE) production, elevate face mask requirements, and rejoin the World Health Organization (WHO), all with a renewed focus on health equity that aligns with the Academy's vision: healthy lives for all people.

The Academy will be focusing its COVID-19 work in 2021 on the following priorities:

- Protect our most vulnerable populations.
- · Support nurses and healthcare providers.
- Accelerate access to and education of COVID-19 vaccines.
- Increase access, speed, and accuracy of testing.







Federal Government Response

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)







- CDC <u>announced</u> an order regarding all air passengers arriving to the US from a foreign country to get tested no more than 3 days before their flight departs and to present the negative result or documentation.
- CDC <u>published a new tool</u> to track the different COVID-19 variants and the amount of known cases in the country.
- CDC <u>published a toolkit</u> for essential workers on the COVID-19 vaccine.
- CDC <u>published a toolkit</u> designed for public health officials, K-12 administrators, school district officials, and occupational safety and health (OSH) professionals to assess hazards and implement mitigation strategies to reduce the spread of Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) in schools.
- CDC <u>published guidance</u> for expanded screening testing to reduce silent spread of SARS-CoV-2.
- CDC <u>released guidelines</u> on "What to Expect at Your Appointment to Get Vaccinated for COVID-19."
- CDC <u>published guidance</u> titled "Operational Considerations for Immunization Services During COVID-19 in Non-US Settings Focusing on Low-Middle Income Countries."

Department for Health and Human Services (HHS)

HHS and the Office for Civil Rights (OCR)
 <u>announced</u> that it will exercise its enforcement discretion and will not impose penalties for violations of the HIPAA Rules on covered health care providers or their business associates in connection with the good faith use of online or web-based scheduling applications (collectively, "WBSAs") for the scheduling of individual appointments for COVID-19 vaccinations during the COVID-19 nationwide public health emergency.
