Academy Update

The American Academy of Nursing (Academy) applauds the National Academy of Medicine (NAM) for convening an expert committee (including several Academy Fellows) dedicated to examining current and future challenges to make sound recommendations for nurses to work towards achieving health equity. The COVID-19 pandemic has amplified the challenges nurses face daily and has demonstrated the power of nurses to advance health equity for all. The Academy joined the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) "We Can Do This" campaign to support efforts to educate the public on the COVID-19 vaccine. HHS <u>launched a new website</u> to promote the campaign and provide resources.

COMMON QUESTIONS ABOUT THE VACCINE WE CAN DO DO THIS		
Do they work?	Yes	All COVID-19 vaccines currently available in the United States are highly effective at preventing COVID-19.
Are they safe?	Yes	The vaccines are safe. While more COVID-19 vaccines are being developed, routine processes and procedures remain in place to ensure the safety of any vaccine that is authorized for use.
Are there side effects?	Yes	You may have side effects. Possible side effects include soreness and swelling at the injection site, fever, chills, fatigue, and headache, but they should go away in a few days.
Do I need to be vaccinated if I've had the virus already?	Yes	There are severe health risks associated with COVID-19 and reinfection with COVID-19 is possible, particularly from new forms (or variants) of the virus that causes COVID-19. You should get vaccinated even if you've already had the virus.

Academy Fellows **Laura N. Gitlin**, PhD, FGSA, FAAN, Dean and Distinguished University Professor, Drexel University and **Rose Ann DiMaria-Ghalili**, PhD, RN, FASPEN, FAAN, FGSA, Professor of Nursing, Associate Dean of Interprofessional Research and Development, Drexel University are two of the leading authors in a <u>new report published</u> by AARP Pennsylvania and Drexel University's College of Nursing and Health Professions. The report, <u>Disrupting Disparities in Pennsylvania Retooling for Geographic</u>, <u>Racial and Ethnic Growth</u>, highlights the geographic, racial/ethnic, and

economic factors that restrict access to healthcare services in Pennsylvania, especially among older adults, and how these factors have been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. This in-depth analysis provides several key recommendations including increasing broadband and telehealth access as well as the ability of providers to care for patients in telehealth settings. Additionally, the report calls attention to nursing and health professional shortages throughout the state as well as the critical need to better prepare a health care workforce to provide culturally competent care in prevention and chronic disease management. This timely

report provides a path forward for caring for older adults in historically underserved areas through innovative approaches, especially as the nation continues to distribute COVID-19 vaccines and information.

Fellow Vaccine Efforts

The University of North Carolina Greensboro (UNCG) School of Nursing collaborated with the Guilford County Health Department to provide a clinic on the UNCG campus during March and April to vaccinate the public against COVID-19. The clinic was organized by **Audrey Snyder**, PhD, RN, ACNP-BC, FAAN, FAEN, FAANP, Associate Dean for Experiential Learning and Innovation, and over the 6 weeks the clinic operated over 7,400 vaccines were administered. Twenty-four nursing faculty and 101 nursing students along with nursing alumni staffed the clinic contributing more than of 5,000 hours of clinical time (pictured below).



Tener Goodwin Veenema, PhD, MS, MPH, RN, FAAN, has been working with the national <u>CommuniVax Coalition</u>, which is strengthening national and local COVID-19 vaccination efforts in the United States by putting communities of color at the center of those endeavors. The coalition is listening to Black, Hispanic/Latino, and Indigenous individuals on how best to promote awareness of, access to, and acceptability of COVID-19 vaccines in their respective communities and is developing longstanding, local governance systems that enable underserved groups to exercise collective agency over their own health and wellness, during this pandemic and going forward. As co-chair of the coalition's Implementation workgroup, Dr. Veenema has <u>hosted a webinar</u> on the importance of a community-centric public health approach.
