August 1: The Academy, along with 50 members of the Nursing Community Coalition (NCC), sent a letter to Representative Lauren Underwood (D-IL-14) and Senator Cory Booker (D-NJ) thanking them for introducing the **Black Maternal Health Momnibus Act (H.R.3305/S.1606)**. The Momnibus Act provides a multipronged approach to addressing maternal health in the United States and improving maternal health outcomes, particularly among Black mothers. Read more.

July 25: The Academy joined an amicus brief along with the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and other health care organizations challenging the state of Idaho's **legislation limiting access to gender-affirming care to individuals under the age of eighteen**. Read more.

July 24: The Academy, along with 55 members of the Nursing Community Coalition (NCC), joined a letter to Sen. Jeff Merkley and a bipartisan group of 11 cosponsors thanking them for introducing the **Nurse Corps Tax Parity Act (S.1446)**. This bill aims for parity between the Nurse Corps and other federal programs such as the National Health Service Corps by ensuring that the Nurse Corps is not subject to federal taxes. <u>Read more</u>.





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The United States has the highest rate of maternal mortality among similar high-income countries, and these statistics continue to worsen. The Academy has a longstanding commitment to addressing the causes, consequences, and solutions to combat prominent issues related to maternal and infant health. It is vital that nurses and key policymakers make critical investments to address social determinants of health (SDOH) that negatively affect the health outcomes of mothers and their children. The Academy further commends the work of the Black Maternal Health Caucus, co-chaired by Representatives Lauren Underwood and Alma Adams, for their leadership and commitment to improving maternal health in our country and for designing a comprehensive plan to address the maternal health crisis, especially among Black and underserved mothers, through the Black Maternal Health Momnibus Act of 2023 (H.R. 3305/S.1606). The Academy remains ready to support bold policies through the work of our Expert Panels on Maternal & Infant Health and Women's Health to ensure that disproportionately impacted mothers and babies have access to critical resources, health care coverage, high-quality health, and community-based and social support. In addition to joining the recent letters to Representative Underwood and Senator Booker supporting the Black Maternal Health Momnibus Act highlighted above, below are a few actions the Academy has taken to address the maternal health crisis:

- The Academy has attended the Black Maternal Health Caucus's Stakeholder Summit every year since 2019.
- The Academy, along with 243 other organizations, signed onto a letter to Congressional leaders in support
 of the maternal health provisions included in the Committee on Energy and Commerce's Build Back Better
 Act. The Energy and Commerce Committee print of the Act included Congresswoman Lauren
 Underwood's Black Maternal Health Momnibus Act previously supported by the Academy. Read more.
- The Academy sent a letter to Congresswoman Lauren Underwood supporting her bill, the Black
 Maternal Health Momnibus Act of 2021 (Momnibus). The Momnibus is a set of 12 individual bills that aim
 to improve maternal health outcomes in the United States, particularly among Black mothers. The bills
 address issues such as COVID-19, climate change, mental health, female veteran care, and vaccines. Read
 more.
- The Academy signed onto a letter requesting Congress to add maternal and infant health components to
 the Cures 2.0 Act. The letter stressed that issues of access to maternity care, workforce shortages, and
 outcome disparities must be addressed as part of the pandemic response. Read more.
- The Academy, along with the Council for the Advancement of Nursing Science (CANS), submitted
 recommendations and comments to the National Institutes of Health (NIH) regarding its Strategic Plan for
 the fiscal years 2021 to 2025. The Academy and CANS applauded the broad, cross-cutting themes included
 in the plan while highlighting the need for eliminating health disparities, and maternal mortality in
