Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, **Cynda Rushton**, PhD, RN, FAAN, has <u>highlighted</u> the critical importance of prioritizing the mental health and well-being of nurses. The Anne and George L. Bunting Professor of Clinical Ethics for Johns Hopkins University's School of Nursing, Dr. Rushton is an expert on the ethics of care and moral resiliency.
