## President's Message

Dear Fellows,

The poet e.e. cummings celebrated spring for being "mud-luscious" and "puddle-wonderful" in 1920; Simon and Garfunkel brought that sense, or feeling, of this season of revival to an eminently sing-able, hum-able, and memorable song on their album, "The Sounds of Silence," in 1964:

<u>April</u>, come she will When streams are ripe and swelled with rain...



Much earlier, in 1866, Christina Rossetti had caught the essence of the spirit of spring, here:

There is no time like Spring, When life's alive in everything...

*Life's alive in everything.* So perfect; such an apt description of the rejuvenation, renewal, and fresh start that April brings. So it is that April ("come she will," and she does) reigns as the hope-filled month of new births, great launches, and grand ideas—including the American Academy of Nursing. On April 24, 1973, the Academy's 36 charter Fellows held their first meeting. How small, and perhaps tentative, the Academy must have seemed to those first Fellows—perhaps especially to the ten who formed the Governing Council and the inaugural president, Rheba de Tornyay. But the time was right—spring, *when streams are ripe and swelled with rain*.

Just as the crocuses, jonquils, and daffodils of spring do not arise from nothing, though, the Academy had started almost three decades earlier, as an *idea*. What if...what if there could be a structure within a professional nursing organization to recognize and advance scientific evidence? That idea, which emerged from a report to the House of Delegates of the American Nurses Association (ANA) in 1946, remained dormant until 1964, when Luther Christman introduced a motion at the ANA biennial convention to convene a committee to study the feasibility of bringing it to life by establishing the Academy. Still, nine years passed before the first class of Fellows met and made the Academy a real, functioning entity. Moments in the journey from 1973 to 2023 have been at times exhilarating and rewarding or discouraging and disappointing—but they have been always unifying; our history and shared values have brought us, and kept us, together.

There are so many stories of those times—five decades worth. I cherish my own memories and stories as I think back on six years on the Board and the unique experience of being the first male president of the Academy (Luther might smile to know about that, 58 years after his motion passed). But there are many, many other stories; imagine how uplifting it will be to hear more of them. It will put a spring in our collective step, so to speak. Last week, the Academy asked Fellows to share why this organization is important to them and how it has been a voice for the profession. Please participate! Help us weave the digital fabric of our history. You can submit your Academy recollections through the <u>survey</u> anytime between now and **Friday, July 28, 2023**.

And what about the stories of the nurses who got the Academy started-the charter Fellows? During this 50th

anniversary year, we will remember their names, understand who they were, share what we know of their stories, and celebrate the legacy they created. At the end of this message, you will find the full list of the 1973 class of Fellows; we will be featuring more about them as we mark **Founders' Day** on April 24, 1973.

It is fitting that our founding month is in April, this month of generation, renewal, and new life. Let us use this month to envision the future and chart a path forward, much as the Academy's leaders did 50 years before us. As Jimmy Cliff would sing it:

<u>I can see clearly now the rain is gone</u> <u>I can see all obstacles in my way</u> <u>Gone are the dark clouds that had me blind</u> <u>It's gonna be a bright (Bright)</u> <u>Bright (Bright) sun-shining day</u> <u>It's gonna be a bright (Bright)</u> <u>Bright (Bright) sun-shining day</u>.
