



PhD Program Director

The University of Rochester School of Nursing is seeking a full-time faculty associate professor or full professor (final rank and tenure eligibility commensurate with experience and established criteria for School of Nursing faculty) to serve as the PhD Program Director. Additionally, this faculty member will focus on conducting research, teaching and mentoring, and contributing to the leadership of the School.

The PhD Program Director is the academic administrative officer responsible for the PhD program in the School of Nursing. The Program Director ensures that the standards and policies of the University and the School of Nursing (as applicable) are met in the PhD program, and further, that the program achieves the highest standards for PhD education as outlined by national bodies in nursing and higher education: the American Association of Colleges of Nursing and Middle States Commission on Higher Education.

The program director is responsible for facilitating the planning, implementation, evaluation, and continuous improvement of the School of Nursing's PhD in Nursing & Health Science program.
