Policy Update

The Academy, working with the [Women's Health Expert Panel](#), was pleased to submit comments on the **NIH Strategic Plan for Research on Women's Health**, recommending that NIH build a Women's Precision Medicine Cohort to participate in proteogenomic and epigenetic research for the development of emerging approaches to disease prevention and treatment. The Academy recommended research targeting diseases that burden minority and vulnerable populations. Also, the Academy encouraged NIH to broaden its commitment to funding research on comprehensive women's sexual and reproductive health including contraceptive methods, STIs, HIV, infertility, and the impacts of restrictive policies.

Joining with other organizations representing the Nursing Community Coalition, the Academy co-signed a letter to Representatives Paul Tonko and Ben Ray Lujan thanking them for introducing the **Addiction Treatment Access Improvement Act of 2017 (HR 3692)** that would broaden the Controlled Substances Act to include APRNs to expand access to patients experiencing opioid addictions. The legislation would create a permanent solution so that nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, certified registered nurse anesthetists, and certified nurse-midwives are able to use their clinical training to help combat this national crisis.
