The School of Nursing and Health Studies (SNHS) at the University of Washington Bothell invites applications for 1 full-time (100% FTE), 9 month, Assistant Professor, tenure-track position. This position is a state-funded, hard money position. All University of Washington faculty engage in teaching, research, and service.

We are seeking an exceptional candidate who embodies the University of Washington Bothell's core values of transformational education and engaged scholarship, and who is excited to work with committed colleagues in an inclusive and interdisciplinary culture of learning. In addition, the successful candidate should possess expertise in the following areas, although we encourage applications from candidates with a wide range of interests in health-related fields: **Healthcare/Organizational Administration and Leadership; Behavioral Health; Community/Population Health; and Health Informatics.**

Candidates must have demonstrated competence in teaching and evidence of an active research program and must have either: 1) an earned doctorate or foreign equivalent in Nursing and a Washington State nursing license or qualifications to obtain one; or 2) an earned doctorate or foreign equivalent in a health-related field and a BSN degree from an accredited program and a Washington State nursing license or qualifications to obtain one.

The University of Washington Bothell is the fastest growing and most diverse campus in Washington State. We are an interdisciplinary institution, and SNHS faculty have the opportunity to develop and engage in creative and innovative approaches to health-related courses and scholarship. Our programs are poised for exciting new directions in the coming years.
