Articles of Incorporation of the
American Association of Pharmaceutical Scientists
A Nonprofit Corporation

We have signed these articles as incorporators of a non-profit corporation formed under the District of Columbia Non-profit Corporation Act; we are over the age of twenty-one; and we state:

1. Name. The name of the corporation is the American Association of Pharmaceutical Scientists.

2. Duration. The duration of the corporation is perpetual.

3. Purposes. The purposes of the corporation are:

To seek the advancement and dissemination of knowledge related to discovery, design, analysis, production, quality control, clinical evaluation, distribution and utilization of drugs and drug delivery systems.

To serve its membership, the pharmaceutical sciences as a whole, the biomedical and biotechnological community, the profession of pharmacy, and the public interest by the following means:

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- provide a forum for interchange of scientific knowledge
- act as a resource in forming public policy relevant to the pharmaceutical sciences
- promote the pharmaceutical sciences collectively and provide for recognition of individual achievement
- foster career growth and development of members

To represent scientific interests within the profession of pharmacy, serve an advocacy role for the pharmaceutical sciences, and promote the economic vitality of the pharmaceutical sciences

and scientists.

To monitor and encourage high standards of education and to exercise a presence in the international scientific community.

4. Membership. Membership in the corporation is available and gives voting privileges to one or more classes of individuals who support the objectives of the Association and are willing to contribute to the achievement of these objectives as stated in the bylaws of the corporation.

5. Directors. The manner of election of directors is as stated in the bylaws of the corporation.

6. Initial Directors. Three directors serve as the initial Board of Directors of the corporation until successors are elected; their names and addresses are:

9. Dissolution. If the corporation should be dissolved, no member will receive any portion of its remaining assets or property; upon dissolution, the balance of any assets or property of the corporation which remains after all debits or obligations are paid will be distributed to any other nonprofit corporation which has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be exempt from federal income taxes.
