What integrations it does offer with third-party platforms are severely limited in comparison to Google Workspace's robust and stable integrations.

If you're used to using Excel, you might find a slight learning curve in switching to Sheets but Google's workspace stands its ground to Office, particularly when it comes to remote access.
