




Nigeria

Abula (Net & Court)

Other African games
History & rules - Abula

- Simple! Think Volleyball but with a paddle!
- You can win the point either as server or receiver
- If 15 all, 2-point clear margin to win.
- If no margin achieved, first to 20 wins














Indigenous Australia

Buroinjin (invasion)

History & games rules

- Game starts with toss up at half-way line
- Pass with hands only; no fists nor kicking
- If touched by opposition, allowed two steps before throwing high in the air
- Game continues if ball is dropped (pick-up, no diving); no handover
- Point scored once run into, or passed and caught in oppositions goal area
- Restart at half-way mark












Afghanistan

Jozbazzi (Target)

Other Afghan games

- Player stands in circle and throws flat stone to land in level 1 area
- If successful, kicks stone back to circle whilst standing on 1 leg.
 Can use multiple kicks. If kicking leg touches floor at any point, turn ends
- Throw to land in level 2 and repeat.
- First person to complete level 4 first is the winner

Sepak Takraw (Net & Court)

History and rules



- 3 players per team (striker, server, feeder)
- Feeder tosses ball to server circle to start
- 3 serves per team before swapping
- First to 21 wins, with tiebeaker rule if score is 20-20


Dandaclid (Striking/Fielding & Target)

Other Afghan games

- A large stick (danda) is used to hit a small stick (clid)
- One player hits the clid from within inner circle
- Other player retrieves the clid and throws back to land in outer circle area
- Swap after each point. First to 5 points

Success in throwing back in = Retreivers point

Fails to throw back in – Batters point

TEACHING PRINCIPLES

Cultural Competence Ability to put plans into practice

- Build relationships with cultures through people, organisations, and communities
- Active involvement in the cultural community (events, activities, volunteering)

Cultural Safety

- Consult community representatives, empower their community and work at their pace to build trust
- Be open about your intentions and accept and acknowledge other people's input
- Provide culturally safe and appropriate experiences
