**Objective: Scientific Inquiry Skills**

### I Spy the Moon

**Instructions:**

1. Go outside or look out of a window.
2. Describe the moon to the child.
3. Allow the child to explain what they see in the sky.
4. Let the child explain what they see on their own, without adding anything to the child's description.

**Questions to extend learning:**

- What do you see in the sky?
- What color is the moon?
- What shape is the moon?

**Materials:**

- Outside and/or a window



**What will children learn?**

The child will learn how to communicate with their family and peers. Parents can engage their child more by going off their observations. The child will be able to express in their own words what they observe. The child will be working on language development.

**Learning Objectives:**
