

Drawing Pictures

Directions:

- Have your child draw a picture and ask what they have created?

Materials:

- Crayons
- Paper

Questions to extend learning:

- Ask your child what colors he/she used?
- Ask your child why they drew their picture the way they did.
- Ask your child who/what is in the picture? Ask your child about the parts of their picture.
- If he/she draws a person, ask him/her to point out each body part, and if it is a boy or a girl, a baby, child, or adult. If he/she draws a house, ask about the different rooms.
- If he/she draws an animal, ask him/her to point out the different parts of the animal and where the animal lives. Prompt your child if he/she needs assistance. For example, if your child says they have drawn a lion ask your child if lions live in a house or a zoo.

**Areas targeted:**

Cognitive Development – Attends and engages.

Language Development – Uses language to express thoughts and needs and uses appropriate conversational and other communication skills.

Physical Development – Demonstrates fine-motor strength and coordination.
