

Toy Color Sorting

What to do:

- Choose a space within your house (living room, bedroom, family room, etc.).
- Families will take the color paper and place them on a flat surface. Then allow the child to bring out their toys. As the child explores, ask questions about the color of the toy.
- Then point to the different color paper and say the name of each color of the paper.
- Invite the child, to place the toy on matching the color paper.
- If the toy has multiple colors, allow the child to choose what color they want to place the color on. This will give the child a sense of independence.
- Count each toy on each color.

Materials Needed:

Toys (different colors), colorful paper (or white paper that you color with a crayons, markers, colored pencils)
