Chant the following rhyme: Riddle dee dee, riddle dee dee. Can you make a rhyme with me?

I say [ball], you say [fall]. [Ball], [fall], [mall], [hall]. 2

Provide the first two rhyming words and invite your child to continue making rhymes with that word.

Try it again with another word and take turns choosing the rhyming words as long as children are interested.

Have fun with nonsensical words as you rhyme! It doesn't have to be a real word for children to build on their rhyming skills.

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Why Rhyming is good for kids: Rhyming teaches children how language works. It helps them notice and work with the sounds within words. ... When children are familiar with a nursery rhyme or rhyming book, they learn to anticipate the rhyming word. This prepares them to make predictions when they read, another important reading skill.
