

## STORY SEQUENCING

### What to do:

1. Parents and children choose a book/story to read together.
2. Parents name the order of the events or actions taking place in the story as you read. (\_\_\_ happened first, \_\_\_ happened second, Use words like next, after that, finally or last).
3. Parents, after the story is done, ask your child to tell you what happened in order. Parents show the pages to help children remember if needed. Children draw three pictures from the story in order (first, second and last). Parents label the pictures first, second and last. (Alternative: Parents and children, discuss the order of the story.)

### Materials:

Scrap paper  
Book/Story  
Pencils/Crayons



### Why is this activity important?

Literacy/Sequencing: Teaching children literacy by sequencing/ordering stories and direction helps children develop necessary skills such as reasoning and inferring. It also helps them to become better writers as they learn there is a logical sequence of events in stories. This will also help children to explore sequencing in the world.
