

Early Learning Programs

Our directly-operated and partner-based Early Learning Programs provide high-quality center-based environments, home-visiting, and parent education for pregnant women and children throughout South Suburban Cook County. These programs prepare children to enter kindergarten ready to learn and thrive.

Family Resources

We administer the Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) in Cook County on behalf of the Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS) and offer enhanced child care referrals to assist families in finding and paying for child care for children ages six weeks to 12 years old.
