# How much are families paying for child care?

MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME: \$70,757

**INFANT:** Average annual price of licensed care

Home-based: \$9,134

Center-based: \$14,286

This is 13%-20% of a family's income.

PRESCHOOLER: Average annual price of licensed care

Home-based: \$8,465

Center-based: \$10,071

This is 12%-14% of a family's income.

The cost of center care rivals college tuition: \$14,579
