MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME: \$77,561

INFANT: Average annual price of licensed care



Home-based: **\$9,504**



Center-based: **\$12,585**

This is **12%-16%** of a family's income.

PRESCHOOLER: Average annual price of licensed care



Home-based: **\$8,287**



Center-based: **\$8,686**

This is **11%-11%** of a family's income.

The cost of center care rivals college tuition: **\$14,579**
