MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME: \$70,843

INFANT: Average annual price of licensed care



Home-based: **\$9,495**



Center-based: **\$13,537**

This is **13%-19%** of a family's income.

PRESCHOOLER: Average annual price of licensed care



Home-based: **\$8,275**



Center-based: **\$9,887**

This is **12%-14%** of a family's income.

The cost of center care rivals college tuition: **\$14,579**
