### How much are families paying for child care?

#### MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME: \$116,450

**INFANT:** Average annual price of licensed care

Home-based: \$10,380

This is **9%-13%** of a family's income.

**PRESCHOOLER:** Average annual price of licensed care

- Home-based: \$8,805
  - Center-based: \$11,278

This is 8%-10% of a family's income.

The cost of center care rivals college tuition: \$14,579
