### How much are families paying for child care?

**MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME: \$76,192** 

**INFANT:** Average annual price of licensed care

Home-based: \$7,236

Center-based: \$11,696

This is 9%-15% of a family's income.

PRESCHOOLER: Average annual price of licensed care

Home-based: \$6,983

Center-based: \$8,686

This is 9%-11% of a family's income.

The cost of center care rivals college tuition: \$14,579
