MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME: \$61,233

INFANT: Average annual price of licensed care



Home-based: **\$10,203**



Center-based: **\$14,438**

PRESCHOOLER: Average annual price of licensed care



Home-based: **\$8,848**



Center-based: **\$10,199**

This is **14%-17%** of a family's income.

The cost of center care rivals college tuition: **\$14,579**
