We are seeking chapter proposals for a 2027 edited book in AEJMC's <u>Master Class</u> series. This eighth book in the series focuses on practical, experience-based approaches to implementing High-Impact Practices (HIPS) in journalism and media studies programs.

This book will serve as a practical guide filled with tested strategies, challenges, solutions, and lessons learned from the field. The target audience is teachers seeking replicable models and actionable takeaways that can be adapted for different institutional contexts, whether they teach in journalism, persuasive communication, media production, or media studies.

- Overview of the HIP as implemented in your program or classes, with an eye on how they could be implemented elsewhere.
- Step-by-step guidance on planning, execution, and assessment.
- What worked, what didn't, and why.
- Practical tools and resources.
- Reflections and advice for faculty considering similar approaches.

We are especially interested in contributions that:

- Are transparent about challenges and solutions.
- Address diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility in HIP design and delivery.
- Can be adapted to different types of media programs and institutional contexts.
