2. Supporting documentation is accepted, however, will only be used to enhance the narrative and will not be considered if the narrative does not address the criteria. No more than 10 pages of supporting documentation will be considered. The narrative should reference the supporting documentation. Information from the supporting documents, but not included in the narrative **will not** be considered by the judges.
3. Each complete application will include three pieces: 1.) Nomination form, 2.) Narrative answering criteria questions and 3.) Supporting documents. All nominations, including letters of support, must be submitted online in a PDF or Word document. Please include the award category for which the nomination is being submitted in the subject line of the email.

## **2021 NPD Nomination Form Criteria Questions**

### **Category - Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy**

This award recognizes service by an individual or group of young people ages 5-23 who demonstrate outstanding commitment to the community through direct financial support, development of charitable programs, community projects, volunteering, and leadership in philanthropy in Alaska.

Nominations will be considered based on the responses to the following criteria:

1. Description in detail of what the nominee did, including goals, process, budget (if relevant) and other people involved in the process (adult leaders or adviser, etc.), and of the time, talent and/or treasure the youth gave for the common good and the results that were achieved. (0-40 points)
2. Description of the impact the nominee had on the community, including numbers of people involved, financial impact, organizations helped, dollars raised etc. Please include the names and contact information of individuals at the organizations who benefited from the nominee's work. (0-30 points)
3. Long-term (1-2 years) impact of the nominee's work. Will the project(s) be ongoing and has the nominee considered next steps or is working on other projects? (0-20 points)
4. Evidence that the project(s) can serve as a prototype for others or is easily replicable in other communities. (0-10 points)

Note: Previous award recipients may be honored again, but preference will be given to individuals who have not received an award.
